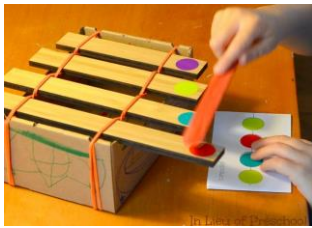
Grass Heads
